



£10,000 scholarships for Master's degree students

Dear Tutors and Admissions Officers,

The OR Society is offering a Master's degree scholarship of up to £10,000 for the 2025/2026 academic year to help with the tuition fees of UK national students interested in operational research (OR). The aim of the scholarship is to facilitate the study of an OR-related Master's degree for a student who would not otherwise be able to pursue this. We invite you to promote and encourage appropriate students to apply for this scheme.

As the applicants must be acceptable to their universities of choice, we would like the postgraduate admissions officers for the OR (or related) Master's degrees to complete the application forms with the students and submit them to The OR Society. The scholarship candidates will be assessed on their academic records, previous experiences and achievements and their supporting statements, which should provide information about their background and articulate their interests in OR and reasons for applying.

In previous years the information provided by admissions officers has been invaluable when deciding between two candidates of similar calibre. Although it is not required, it can make a real difference to the students' applications when admissions officers can provide a personal statement about the applicant in addition to confirming they meet the scholarship criteria.

The university will be responsible for selecting the most suitable candidates from their applicants. The OR Society is fully committed to promoting diversity and the scholarships are available to any individual to help fulfil their potential, irrespective of their background or circumstances.

The deadline for applications is 28 February 2025 and we hope to notify successful candidates at the end of March. The successful candidate(s) will be encouraged to become a local ambassador for The OR Society, helping to promote OR and raise awareness of the society. Where one exists, they will be encouraged to do this as part of the Student OR Club. We will invite the successful candidate(s) to submit articles about their experiences to our monthly newsletter over the course of their studies and beyond, if they stay in OR.

We hope that universities will support this exciting and important initiative. Our ambitions are that the scholarships will support the pipeline of students going into OR careers; that these scholarships will be seen as prestigious and be sought after; and that The OR Society will continue to fund a scholarship scheme when finances allow.

Application for The OR Society master's degree scholarship funding

The judges will review your academic record and personal statement, with the statement provided by your admissions tutor. It is important that your personal statement includes the key points we highlight on page three.

Please review the following information carefully. The OR Society works to support students and raise awareness of OR among students through several outreach efforts, such as our OR in Education outreach programme, our free student membership, Careers Open Day and this scholarship. We ask that the recipient(s) of this scholarship join us in this work. In particular, we ask that recipients of the scholarship:

- Join the OR Society as a free student member
- Write three 500 word articles for our magazine, InsideOR. The articles will be spread throughout the academic year. The first article is typically an introduction to the scholarship recipient and what the scholarship means to them, the second an update on how their studies are progressing and the third a final update on their studies and future plans.
- Work with our Education Manager to promote The OR Society to students at their university. This could include helping us to promote student membership of The OR Society or promoting our free careers fair, Careers Open Day.
- Speak at an OR Society event after their graduation. This short talk will depend on the recipient's availability and may take place at Careers Open Day or the New2OR conference. The talk topic will depend on the event but will typically involve promoting the Master's Scholarship and discussing the recipient's experiences in OR. Travel expenses for in-person events may be paid by The OR Society.
